Soprano saxophone phenomenon **Anders Paulsson** is probably the first musician in the world who is successfully pursuing a classical solo career on this rare instrument. Mr. Paulsson made his Carnegie Hall debut in 1992 and has since performed extensively and taught master classes on the soprano saxophone in the United States, Brazil, Japan, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, the Faroe Islands, Iceland, Norway, Denmark, and at home in Sweden. He has been a guest artist at many international music festivals and has collaborated with many prominent performing artists. Many of his performances have been broadcast on national television and radio in the United States, England, Sweden, Finland, Estonia, and Israel, and his recordings have received high acclaim from music critics and audiences worldwide.



Andrew Canning is one of the leading organists of his generation. In 1996 Mr. Canning was appointed Assistant Organist and Director of Music at Uppsala Cathedral and in 2001, Organist to Uppsala University (the first such appointment ever made in Sweden). Between 1991 and 2002 he was artistic director of the Uppsala Cathedral Boys' Choir and led the choir on several successful tours to Finland, Spain, and Poland. Mr. Canning is now chiefly responsible for the cathedral's regular recital series and the accompaniment of the liturgy in the cathedral's daily offices. As an organ soloist he has broadcast many times on American, Swedish, and Finnish radio and television, and has performed in Europe, Japan, Russia, and the United States. He has made numerous CD recordings with artists such as Peter Mattei, Alice Babs, Nils Lindberg, Steve Dobrogosz, and Anders Paulsson.
